

Thoughts from Pastor Rachel

By the time you read this, it will probably be cold again. But as I am writing, we are all still enjoying the unseasonably warm temperatures. These past few days have been wonderful – well, maybe not so much for the ice fishermen – but after months of bundling up in hat, gloves and scarves, it is a pleasure to walk outside without the burden of winter clothes and feel the warmth of the sun on exposed skin.

In my neighborhood, I witnessed people riding their bikes and cleaning garages, kids building snowmen while the snow melted around them, and a few brave souls sporting shorts and t-shirts. And in church on Sunday, we complained about it being too warm!

We knew it wouldn't last. We knew it was too soon to say goodbye to the snow and icy temps. But we enjoyed the mild weather while we could. For us it was a reminder of the promise of spring to come. For a few days, we got a glimpse of what awaits us in a few months. And it gives us a boost of hope.

Now I know some of you actually enjoy the bitter cold and perhaps winter is your favorite season, so this analogy may not work so well. In any event, the coming spring brings with it the promise of new life. But in the cold of winter, the animals huddle in their dens, the bulbs lie dormant underground, and the migratory birds (and people!) continue their southern vacations. The northern climes remain still, anticipating the coming rebirth.

As we've been studying the Gospel of Matthew in worship, we have noticed that one of Matthew's main themes is the coming Kingdom of God. The advent of Jesus signaled the arrival of God's kingdom or realm. In this kingdom the promises of God will be completely realized, and all heaven and earth will experience love, mercy, peace, and compassionate justice. In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus identifies the attributes of the kingdom and of our identities as followers of God. But we also understand that the kingdom has not fully arrived, because we still witness hatred, division, strife and injustice in the world.

But every so often we catch glimpses of that kingdom. We experience it in those moments of grace, when the ice of injustice melts into the gentle flow of fairness and equity and when the bitter cold of hatred and prejudice becomes the warmth of reconciliation and friendship.

At times those moments of grace may seem fleeting, but when they occur, they are a reminder of what is to come. In them our hope in God's promises is rekindled, and our anticipation of the full realization of God's Kingdom in Christ is restored. Friends, God is at work around us and within us. Let us be bearers of that promise into a cold and dormant world.

There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. 1 Corinthians 12:4-5 God has blessed each of us with unique gifts. Some have gifts in teaching, healing, or in providing leadership. Other gifts, though perhaps at times less visible, are of equal value to God.

As time goes on we develop our skills and deepen our passions, especially in things that come easy to us or are very enjoyable. We find new interests, re-directing us into new ways that we can use our lives in God's service. Throughout life's transitions, Christ helps us to find ways to do His work with the gifts that He has given us. If we seek God's direction, He shows us what to do and where to be.

Recently the Nominating Committee met and began the process of putting together a slate of candidates for the Board of Deacons and Ruling Elder. There are many reasons for not being able to serve as a Deacon or an Elder, most come down to the time not being right for you. Our task will be made easier as you consider your interests... consider your passions... consider your gifts.

Almost 6 years ago, I accepted the call to be a deacon. I was baptized, confirmed, and married in this church. My children were baptized and confirmed here, my daughter married here, and 2 of our grandchildren baptized here. I was comfortable here. Over the year's I had helped out when and where I could, teaching Sunday School, helping with Deacon projects here and there, ushering, lending a hand when hands were called for.

I was perfectly happy helping out occasionally. Accepting that call was stepping out of my comfort zone. Three years serving as Deacon Moderator and now almost 3 years serving on Session and as Mission Team Leader have been challenging in ways I hadn't imagined. Challenges that strengthened my faith and deepened my relationship with Christ.

I have gotten to know other church members who I've known for years in totally new ways and formed friendships with new folks both among church members and those outside of our church family. This has been one of the most meaningful times in my life.

The time may be right for you. When we call on you we ask that you prayerfully consider the call to Christ's service in new and challenging ways. The Nominating Committee may overlook you as we seek God's guidance in this task. Speak with myself, or any of the committee, Kristin Janis, Sarah Slayton, Mary Aughenbaugh, Sandy DeSciscio, Andy Bethel, and Jen Faust and let us know of your desire to share your gifts. Be warned that serving is one of the most rewarding experiences you may have.

Seasonal allergies

If you sneeze and have itchy and watery eyes and/or nose during certain times of the year, you may have seasonal allergies. Symptoms can be similar to the common cold, and the best way to tell the difference between the two is how long the symptoms last- a common cold often lasts less than 14 days, while seasonal allergies can bother a person for months. Seasonal allergies usually happen in the spring, late summer, and fall. The most common causes are outdoor pollen, grass, mold, and weeds. Preventing outdoor seasonal allergies can be difficult. You can avoid outdoor activities when pollen or mold counts are high; use air conditioning instead of opening windows or doors; shower and change clothes after being outside; and use a dryer instead of hanging clothes out to dry. In addition to prevention, many people need to take medicines to help treat these symptoms. There are several medicines over-the-counter and by prescription. You can talk with your healthcare provider to decide which options are best for you.
