Reflections from Reverend Rachel

I've always been struck by the dichotomy of December.

The holiday season has arrived and the anticipation of festivity and frivolity is all around us. There are parties to attend, cookies to bake, presents to wrap, family and friends to welcome, and halls to deck. The expectation is one of joy and celebration, good times and laughter. So much so, that we're dubbed a Scrooge if we don't get into the Christmas spirit.

The gods of materialism and consumerism stand mockingly against the Incarnate Babe born in poverty and obscurity. Cheery carols blast from shopping mall speakers in contrast to the quiet hymn tones of Advent's promise. Jolly Santas embrace girls and boys who dream of gold-wrapped toys while a paranoid King Herod plots violence against toddlers in search of his rival. And throughout the month, Facebook preachers scream about the "Reason"

for the Season" and bemoan "the War against Christmas."

It is a season of contradictions.

For those seeking a place to acknowledge the struggles of hurt and pain during the holidays, we are offering a **Service of the Longest Night on the evening of December 21**. This is a fitting time to recognize the darkness we face in our lives, while expressing our longing for the One true Light who is coming into the world.

May we all remember those in our midst for whom the holidays are anything but jolly and bright.

Advent Bible Study

An Advent Bible Study: <u>The Messiah</u>. Sunday mornings from 11:15 am to noon beginning November 30th. This 4 week study was developed by Rev. Dr. Walter Bruegemann, Professor at Columbia Theological Seminary. It is based on Isaiah 9:2-7. Each session will examine one of the four liturgical designations for the anticipated Messiah (Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace). Christians claim that Jesus was the Messiah as foretold in the Hebrew

Scriptures. This study will explore the context of these expectations in Isai-ah's time, and will ask whether or not Jesus fulfilled them. Handouts for the first class are available on the counter in the Library. Contact Marilyn Paulson for more information.


